


Fancy Dress Day: - Wednesday 23rd November.

Brief description of designated roles:

Key workers

Your child's key worker may have changed as of this month so please take a look on your child's key worker board located in their room.

The key worker is also there for you to speak to should you have any concerns or questions regarding your child at nursery.

However Vicki or Aimee is also always available to talk to should you need to talk to them.

Designated Safeguarding officers

Vicki Johnson / Aimee Matthews / Sam Bennett

- are available to go to with any safeguarding concerns. They make decisions linked to the course of action taken when safeguarding concern is raised.

SENCO /Special Education Needs and Disabilities Co-Coordinator.

Highwood's SENCO is Sam Bennett

It is her role to ensure that if a child attends the setting who may need extra support (big or small) receives it. She also liaises with other agencies to ensure support is in place and works with the child's parents and key worker put individual plans (ILPs) in place to support learning and development.

Please speak to her if you have any concerns relating to your child.

<u>Medication co-ordinance</u> - Laura Farmer oversees all the medication in the nursery ensuring that they are in date and staff have relevant training to administer medication.

<u>Lead First Aider - Laura Farmer / Hannah Matthews</u> Ensures all first aid boxes are replenished and in date. Laura Oversees First Aid in the setting.

<u>Fire Marshall</u> - Jade Wright / Alice Naunton are in charge of making sure we prevent fire risks and in the event of a fire everyone in the setting is safe.

<u>Behaviour Coordinator</u> - Vicki Johnson is the person to go to if you have any questions or queries regarding children's behaviour. We have up to date training and can offer some great advice.

<u>Equality and Diversity Coordinator</u> - Tanya O'Brien / Lily Chambers are in charge of making sure that as a nursery we include all religions, cultures, race and sex etc. This can be done in a large number of ways but some are; having people that represent differing skin tones, providing dressing up clothes from differing countries or educating the children about different festivals.

<u>Health and Safety Officer</u> - Aimee Matthews / Jan Hughes is the person is in charge of making sure the nursery is a safe place for everyone to enjoy. If a hazard is noticed it should be reported to her and she will then deal with this as is seen appropriate.

Caterpillar room

The caterpillars have been very busy over the recent weeks creating lots of different craft and displays in and around the baby room. We have explored autumn and collected leaves to create autumn collages. The older caterpillars have also created a lovely autumn display with lots of paint and leaves.

Butterflies



A big warm welcome to all of the new children that have joined us and we wish all the best to the butterflies that have become ladybirds.

As the cold weather arrives we would like parents to bring their children with warm suitable clothing as we will still be venturing out to enjoy the outdoor environment. Can we also remind parents whose children are potty training to ensure that they have spare clothes in their bags.

November 5th is Bonfire night and the children will be taking part in lots of creative activities - splatter painting, spinning patterns on Catherine wheels. We will be having fun exploring messy play such as sparkly corn flour, swirly coloured shaving foam.

We will be discussing how to keep safe /fire safety with the children and link this to people who help us. Starting with Fire fighters using story books, dress up and role play to extend the children's knowledge and understanding. We will then go on to teach the children about all the different people that job is to help us and keep us safe. We may even be lucky enough to have a visit from the fire fighters or police?? Make sure that you look out for our new displays showing you how busy we have been learning about "People Who help us".

The Winter season will be well on truly upon us, therefore we will be discussing the change in weather and what happens in the winter. There will be a winter sensory basket for the children to explore. We will be creating a winter themed display also. The free flow area will be transformed into a winter wonderland that you will be able to walk through and admire the children's creations.

During the festive period leading up to Christmas the children will be participating in Christmas crafts and creating some festive craft that they can bring home to share with you.

In the New Year we will be changing the kitchen role play area into a supermarket role play area. They will have opportunity to extend their imagination through first hand experiences and building relationships together with their friends.

One of the butterfly children's favourite number stories is "10 bears in a bed" we will be getting creative and making 10 bears in a bed with the children developing their counting from 1-10.

Ladybird room



A big warm welcome to our new starters and those that are trialling and beginning a new Journey in the Ladybird room.

Week Commencing 31st October we will be discussing "Diwali" the festival of light. The children will have opportunity to make their own cards and lanterns and have a try at creating beautiful Rangoli patterns as well as developing their hand eye co-ordination threading pipe cleaners through colanders to create fire work effects.

Understanding the world- comment and ask questions about aspects of their familiar world

We will be talking to the children about fire safety and keeping safe during bonfire night, if you go to any bonfire/firework displays please send some photographs to us you can do this by email info@highwooddaynursery.co.uk.

We will be developing the children's listening and attention when identifying what sounds they might hear.

Communication and language- uses talk to connect idea to explain what is happening, recall and relive past experiences

On 11^{th} November we will be having a red day, creating poppies and having lots of red themed activities related to Remembrance Day.

Understanding the world- comment and ask questions about aspects of their familiar world

In group time we will be talking to the children about people who help us enabling the children to join in speaking about occupations and what special jobs people do. We are hoping to get some special visitors to come in and speak to the children.

Underdstanding the world- show interest in occupations of life

Over the festive period the children will be writing their Christmas wish lists, we will be planning a walk into the environment to the local post office to post our letters to Father Christmas at the North pole. This will be linked to changing our role play area into a post office, encouraging children's imagination and basing it on first hand experiences.

Literacy-sometimes give meaning to marks as they draw/paint

The children will be beginning their countdown to Christmas also developing recognition with their names as they will be hidden inside the advent calendar.

Maths-show interest in numbers in the environment

The children will be practising their nativity play and will performing to parents/ carers on Tuesday 6^{th} December, please speak to Aimee or Vicki who will discuss your child's role, any words they will need to rehearse at home and whether you may need to supply your child with a costume.

We will busy creating our goodies to bring home to our families. We will be measuring out ingredients for yummy treat, complete with calendar and card to bring home and share with you.

In January - New year, new term !!!

We will be introducing children to the new season "Winter". We will be using our observation and problem solving skills to watch and explore the changes to ice when it melts.

The children will be busy working together to sort out clothing suitable for hot and cold weather.

P.S.E.D-Can play in a group extending and elaborating play ideas.

The story the children are most familiar with is "Frozen" we will be having a frozen themed day with lots of messy play and activities. Please bring your child dressed in an outfit linked to the "Frozen" theme, Aimee will let you know the date.

All activities linked will enable to develop in their learning.

Literacy- join in with repeated refrains and anticipate key events, phrases in rhymes and stories
